TALLAHASSEE SPRINGTIME



*Tallahassee blends a genteel flavor with the busy urgency of matters of state. The combination of antebellum style and government deliberations may be savored at the restored Old Capitol Museum where Florida's history unfolds, the elegantly staid Supreme Court and the prestigious Governor's mansion. An elegant estate brings a glimpse of an era long past and even further back in history presents a time-traveler experience of Spanish and native culture. Join the **CenterCircle Travelers** on a spring expedition to our state capital.*

Our Travelers will depart from CenterBank at 7:30am on Wednesday, April 2nd. After a hearty breakfast enroute, our first stop is the **Governor's Mansion**, a Georgian style Southern estate featuring antique furnishings and gifts from foreign dignitaries. The **Supreme Court** is the next stop where we will hear some fascinating cases in Florida history. Lunch today is at the chic and trendy, *Urbane Restaurant*, operated by Jacksonville ex-pats Pam and Bruce Pollett. The afternoon venue is the **Old Capitol Museum**, restored to its 1902 appearance and features restored House and Senate Chambers, the Old Supreme Court and Governor's Suite. At some point during the day, depending upon his schedule, we will have a visit with our own local Representative in the Florida House, **Charles McBurney**. We'll end the day at the New Capitol's 22nd floor observatory which exhibits the works of Florida artists. After checking into the hotel, the group will dine at Marie Livingston's Texas Steakhouse and Saloon.

After breakfast on Thursday, it's time to explore the natural beauty of **Wakulla Springs**, one of the world's deepest springs in a beautiful primordial setting. Then the group is off to **Mission San Luis** where the past comes alive through costumed living history, hands-on exhibits, re-creations of period buildings and archeological excavations at the only re-constructed Spanish mission in Florida. We will lunch at **Goodwood Museum and Gardens**, a magnificent c. 1834 estate which features more than twenty structures and a 19-acre heirloom garden.

The CenterCircle Travelers will return to Jacksonville in the early evening, enjoying tasty refreshments along the way. Join us for an exciting experience in our own Capital City!
